1	<p><i>Salix discolor</i> known as Pussy willow. 10m tall. Large attractive tree, vigorous growing, good shade tree, big catkins, flowers late July / early August, excellent bee fodder. Sex unknown**</p>		
5	<p><i>Salix hookeriana</i> known as Dune, Coastal, or Hooker's willow. 5m tall. Grows in coastal habitats such as beaches, marshes and floodplains, excellent bee fodder, flowers early Sept to Oct. Male & female.</p>		
7	<p><i>Salix aegyptiaca (cantabrica)</i> known as Musk willow (PN 229). 5m tall. Hardy, good source of pollen, excellent bee fodder, flowers end July to early Aug. Male & female.</p>		
8	<p><i>Salix pentandra</i> known as Bay willow, Laurel willow or Bay-leaved willow. 15m tall. Hardy, usually grows in wet boggy ground, excellent bee fodder, flowers Nov to late Dec. Female.</p>		
10	<p><i>Salix reichardtii</i> known as Pussy willow. 12m tall. Hardy, moist conditions, excellent bee fodder, flowers Aug to late Sept. Male.</p>		
12	<p><i>Salix repens x purpurea</i> hybrid known as Kumeti (NZ 1057). 3m tall. Hardy, excellent bee fodder, shrubby habit, Ideal low shelter, flowers Oct to Nov. Male.</p>		

13	<p><i>Salix purpurea</i> known as “Pohangina”, Purple Willow or Purple Osier (NZ 1087). 6m tall. Hardy, medium-sized shrub, spreading habit, basket willow, large catkins, excellent bee fodder, flowers mid-Oct to late Nov. Male.</p>		
15	<p><i>Salix daphnoides</i> known as Violet willow. 6m tall. Hardy, magnificent catkins, excellent bee fodder, flowers late winter to early spring. Male.</p>		
21	<p><i>Salix</i> unknown (possibly <i>himalayas</i>). 15m tall. Hardy, excellent bee fodder, tall. Sex unknown**</p>		
25	<p><i>Salix hookeriana</i> – Genotype name: Furry Ness (PN 685). 3-4m tall. Very hardy, attractive leaf, bushy habit, has the largest catkins, excellent bee fodder, grows among coastal sand dunes, flowers late Sept to late Oct. Male.</p>		
26	<p><i>Salix x reichardtii</i> hybrid – Genotype name: Pussy Galore (PN 215). 6-12m tall. Shrub or small tree, abundant, showy, silver catkins, flowers early Aug to end Sept. Male.</p>		
27	<p><i>Salix purpurea</i> hybrid – Genotype name: Rubra (PN 221). Flowers end Aug to early Sept. Male.</p>		

28	<p><i>Salix x forbyana</i> hybrid – Genotype name: Sessilifolia (PN 305). Flowers early Oct to mid Nov. Male.</p>		
29	<p><i>Salix alba</i> – Genotype name: I 2-59 (PN 357). Flowers mid-Sept to early-Oct. Male.</p>		
30	<p><i>Salix alba</i> – Genotype name: I 8-59A (PN 361). Tall tree with dense catkins. Produces a large amount of pollen. Flowers late Sept to early Oct. Male.</p>		
31	<p><i>Salix triandra</i> – Genotype name: Black German (PN 374). Flowers late Sept to early Dec.</p>		
32	<p><i>Salix eriocephala</i> – Genotype name: Americana (PN 376) known as Heart-leaf willow. Very long flowering period from late Aug to mid-Nov, valuable bee fodder, shows some resistance to Giant Willow Aphid.</p>		
33	<p><i>Salix lasiolepis x viminalis</i> (PN 04106073) hybrid. Shows some resistance to Giant Willow Aphid.</p>
